Formal elements of art	The elements that make up a piece of artwork. They are: <i>line</i> , <i>colour</i> , <i>tone</i> , <i>pattern</i> , <i>texture</i> , <i>form</i> , <i>shape</i> and <i>space</i>
Tone	The lightness or darkness of a colour
Texture	How a surface feels or looks like it feels.
Pattern	A design that repeats.
Line	A mark that moves from one place to another. It can vary in width, length or direction.

Formal Elements

We can use the formal elements of art to analyse a piece of artwork:



The texture of the animals fur looks soft.

The darker tones below her chin show shadows.

The texture of her skin is smooth.

The thorn necklace is made up of jagged lines.
