Pitch		How high or low a sound is
Dynamics		How loud or quiet a sound is
Western notation		A universal series of written symbols that are used to communicate musical sounds
Rhythm		A strong pattern of movement or sound. They can be fast or slow and fit over the pulse.

Stave		The five lines that music is written on
Treble clef		A symbol in music that shows all the notes are above middle C
Bass clef	2 ∷	A symbol in music that shows all the notes are below middle C
Crotchet		A note with the value of one beat
Quaver		A note with the value of half of a beat





Duet	A performance by two singers, instrumentalists or dancers
Solo	A performance by one singer, instrumentalist or dancer
Round	A short musical piece in which several voices sing or instruments play the same melody but start at different times
Audience	A group of people who gather together to listen to or watch something

Texture	Monophonic Heterophonic Polyphonic	The way that pitch and rhythm are combined in a piece of music which determines the overall quality of the sound.
Timbre	Timbre Example - Flute and Oboe 2 Distinctive Sounds	The quality or colour of sound that makes one voice differ from another
Tempo		How fast or slow the phrase or piece of music is played
