

















Crotchet		A musical note lasting 1 beat
Lyrics		The words to a song
Ostinato		A repeated musical phrase or rhythm
Paired quavers		two quavers, half a beat each which together equals 1 beat
Pulse		The regular 'heartbeat' of a piece, holding the core timing together in a song
Rhythm		the pattern of sounds played through time, formed by a series of notes




Stick notation		A method of recording rhythm
Tempo		The speed at which a piece of music is played
Timbre		The quality of sound..._e.g. soft, dull



Pitch

Conductor		the person directing a musical performance
Crescendo		Italian for "growing louder" with volume
Diminuendo		Italian for "diminishing", meaning to "grow softer" with volume
Dynamics		How loudly or softly to play a part or piece of music
Pulse		The regular 'heartbeat' of a piece, holding the core timing together in a song

Rhythm		the pattern of sounds played through time, formed by a series of notes
Volume		<u>how</u> loud or quiet a sound is.
Graphic notation		using <u>non standard</u> symbols to represent written music
Tempo		The speed at which a piece of music is played
Timbre		The quality of sound...e.g. soft, dull

Pitch		How high or low a note is
Pitch match -		To sing the same pitches as the leader
Score		A written form of a musical composition showing all the instrumental/ vocal parts
